The Love on the Locals team along with the deacons will be distributing envelopes on April 27, 2025 that include \$10 in "seed" money. Please use these funds and <u>add some of your own</u> to help someone in a personal way face to face, person to person—in a relational way. It can be tempting to call an organization and donate the \$10 to them, but this is not the intention of the Reverse Offering. The Reverse Offering is to help you experience being a missionary in your own community. You will also be asked to write a brief note about what you did with the funds and how the recipient of your gift responded. No names, please. Make sure to explain to the people you bless why you are blessing them! Then return the note to the church in either the offering boxes or to the church office. Help encourage others by sharing how you creatively shared the Love of Jesus.

Some past examples of how people have used the Reverse Offering include:

- Pool your money with others to replace someone's appliance that has gone bad.
- Buy ingredients to make baked goods, have a bake sale, and use the proceeds to purchase groceries for a family.
- Buy the meal or coffee for the car behind you in the drive-thru.
- Bring lunch to the administrative staff at East Elementary.
- Call the Sheldon middle school, tell them you have some extra funds and ask, "What do you need?" You might be amazed what a difference \$10 plus a little of your own money can make!
- Buy diapers for a family with a newborn or young child—they are expensive!!
- Buy pool passes for a family that is not likely to buy them for their children.
