
WE HAVE A FUN OPPORTUNITY AVAILABLE!





While Amy and I are living in Costa Rica for several months, we are

traveling to institutes a fair amount to take advantage of already being in Latin America. The past couple of months have been a good example of this.

We started off with a trip to San Jose, Costa Rica in early February for our 2025 IBAC Staff Gathering. Every year we bring all our IBAC staff together from four different countries. This is a very beneficial time to encourage one-another as well as strategize for the future and discuss current ministry. It was a very blessed and productive time together and by God's leading and provisions, the future of IBAC will be more growth and equipping pastors.

The very next week, we were back on the road to San Francisco de Dos Rios, Costa Rica. We specifically visited this institute to meet with our US church partner. She has never received formal, biblical training and was overwhelmed with joy and appreciation for IBAC coming to teach in Cariari. And because we were in Cariari on March 3, there was a robust singing of Happy Birthday for Amy, a special prayer over her and MANY hugs and kisses.

Next trip...back home to CO. Hard to believe are time in Costa Rica is almost over. We love our little town of Uvita and our friends here. So blessed to call this place "home" even if only for a few months each year.

PRISON LIGHTHOUSE MINISTRY NEWSLETTER, MARCH 2025

"I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly." John 10:10b

Some of the inmates grow up in a culture of death. Many of their friends end up dying. I believe they think that it will not happen to them. A few overdose trying to take their own lives because of the hopelessness

they feel. I have visited with some of them who believe that God has saved them from dying several times. Many inmates know nothing but death around them. They need the hope that Jesus came to give life and life more abundantly.

I wrote about Rory's baptism last July. He told me that when he ended up in jail a year ago, he was getting ready to kill himself. Rory fell on his knees and said, "God if You are real give me hope, and show me that I have a purpose. Please forgive me for all my sins and change my life!" Then he said, "A peace came over me. There was a change in my life from that time on. So many of my friends have died. I have 12 obituaries of my friends on my wall. It is so sad!" Rory had just found out another one of his friends, only 20 years old, died because of drugs. Rory said that he spent much time with him in JDC during his teenage years. He went on to say, "I could be one of those who died, but God has changed my life. I now have hope, and if possible, I would like to get a college education while I am in prison. I have no one in my life to talk to about these things, but you." God has given Rory hope when he had no hope! That is what God does!

I do some aftercare with men who were in prison a few years ago. One of them is Kevin. He is a young man who had


many difficulties during his teenage life. Kevin had been in and out of prison over several years with drug addiction problems. He was in a car accident several months ago and is paralyzed from the waist down. During our hospital visits and now home visits he has had a very good attitude. He mentioned, "I have never completed anything in my life, but now maybe God set me down so I can get a college education?" I send him Bible verses every morning, and he is very appreciative of them. Kevin said, "Those verses give me something to meditate on and they encourage me." He is in touch with the doctors to get his pain under control. He told me, "I do not want to be on a pain med that can get me addicted to it." Please pray for Kevin to have strength from above to deal with this difficult situation. We know that the Lord can do anything and can heal him completely, which would be awesome!

Henry has been dealing with cancer for a while. For the last six months I stopped by his room weekly. He told he had not given his life to the Lord, but he believed the Bible. Henry said, "I am not ready yet." I told him I was concerned for his soul and where he would spend eternity if he died. As time goes on Henry seems to be getting weaker. Many times, he told me that he didn't need a visit. Last week when I visited him, I could see he had hope written on his face. Henry said, "I asked the Lord to forgive my sins and come into my life. God is so merciful. I don't deserve His forgiveness. My sins are many and yet He has forgiven me!" He asked me for a Bible to read. God is good and patient with all of us!

It is a privilege for me to have some of the staff share their family's health concerns with me, asking me to keep them in prayer!

Preparing Students for their Next Steps in God's Mission

From the end of December through the beginning of February we hosted 6,809 students at twelve Winter Conferences^{**} across the country. Winter Conferences are a special opportunity focused on equipping students, wherever they are on their spiritual journey, to grow closer to Jesus. We invite every student to take their next step in God's mission.

Students were challenged to go and take steps of faith. Those steps of faith happened at the conference during our outreach events and are still happening back on campuses even today. During the outreaches, 184 people who heard the gospel indicated decisions for Jesus! Here are two snapshots of how God is working:

During the day of outreach in Orlando, Carson, from FSU, and his friends met a man and his young son with whom they shared the gospel. The father prayed to receive Christ! As Carson shared this back at the conference, he put up his hands and said, "Just wait... it gets better." They took down his information to connect him with the local church and said goodbye. As the boy and his dad left to go to the park, the boy first ran into his house and told his older brother about what had just happened. The older brother ran out of the house, chased Carson and his friends down and gave Carson a huge hug. He said, "I became a Christian a year and a half ago and since then I have been praying for my dad to know Christ. This week I've been fasting and praying for this exact thing to happen!"...to the ends of the Earth.

In Minneapolis, Candice Siewert spoke about how God is working all across the world and the part college students have played in the modern missions movement. She told the story of the "Mount Hermon 100," a group of 100 students that had committed to go to the world in 1886. She asked, "Who will go?" While this seemed like a rhetorical question, one student stood up in the ballroom and said, "I will go!" Candice said, "as I began preparing for this message I've been praying for the 'Minneapolis 100'. Are you willing to say, 'Lord, I'm willing to go'?" As Candice prayed, students around the room began to stand– over 100 students were standing! Praise God for the Minneapolis 100, and the hundreds of other students across the county who said, "Here I am, Lord. Send me"!

Thank you so much for your partnership, your prayers, and your generosity that make it possible for the students to play a part in God's mission!




Prayers & Praises
