


ELDERS/DEACONS MEETINGS AND CONSISTORY MEETING

Friends,

As most of you prepare to celebrate Thanksgiving at the end of the month, know that I am thankful for you! I will celebrate with some friends here, even though it is a regular Thursday for Nicaragua.


We Are Grateful

"It is on my mind a lot," my friend said. "Yes," I replied, "it makes you think a lot about your relationship with God." She began asking me about church and I got to share our vision for studying the





The day in and day out of soccer practices, friendly matches and tournaments is still happening. We spent the past few months talking about the character traits of Jesus that we want to emulate and how they help us in soccer. We talked about how hard it is to consistently show good character traits like self-control or respect without Jesus in our lives. We talked about how we need Jesus to grow those character traits inside of us and that we cannot do it on our own.

These next few weeks we will share the good news of the gospel again with the kids. We do this as often as we can, in as many ways as we can, but there are so many cultural barriers to understanding that we are saved by faith alone and not by works. This is the essence of why we are here, why we coach soccer and try and live our faith out in the community: so people can see, hear and experience the gospel.







Prison Lighthouse Ministry Newsletter, November 2025



"For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord...Therefore encourage one another and build one another up just as you are doing." I Thess. 5:9-10

I believe people can and do get stuck in a lie from the devil. It can be fear of taking the next step in obedience. Fear can keep us from moving forward in life and doing the next thing the Lord has told us to do. But I have seen God use fear to move people forward to invite Christ into their life and trust Him as Lord and Savior. They were fearful of continuing to live their life without Christ and to face eternity without Him! God is awesome in all His ways of how He brings people to salvation!

Michael has been in Administrative Segregation for at least 18 months. Usually, it takes about a year to get out of that area and back into population. I believe one of the reasons why he does not want to come out from Segregation could be fear of what others will do to him because he wants out of the gang life. I have no doubt that he is a Christian. Michael has told me that, "I can serve the Lord back here in segregation as well as in population." I mentioned, "There might be some truth to that, but when you are in population you can attend church and Bible studies." Last week he told me, "My life is just a broken mess!" We talked about that when we recognize we are broken; it can be a new beginning. God can put us back together when we put our faith in Jesus and His Word!

It has been a year since I visited James. He told me, "I want to be a Christian, but the faith I grew up in does not believe Jesus is God. I have a hard time believing that Jesus is God, but I grew up with

Christian friends. I attended Bible studies with them. I want to get out of the gang life. It has been nothing but trouble for me and my life is going nowhere. Hell scares me and I don't want to go there." We went over the gospel message again and emphasized the passages where Jesus claimed to be God. James told me he would read the book of John. We talked about how important it is to ask God for understanding when reading the Bible! We prayed together for God to show him the truth from the Bible. Pray for James to know the truth of the gospel!

It is time again to raise funds for inmate Christmas sacks. In times past churches were involved in making fudge for the sacks. Now that is no longer an option. All the items must be prepackaged. The incarcerated men and women look forward to these sacks. They are a reminder that they are not forgotten by society. Dear First Reformed Church,

For many Christians in India, **following Jesus comes with a cost.** Families are torn apart. Jobs are lost. Believers are harassed, beaten, or even threatened with death.


But even in the middle of fear and rejection, **God's Word gives them courage.** Let me tell you about Rina.

Rina's life has not been easy. More than ten years ago, her husband was sent to prison and she lost her job as a bank teller. Overnight, she had no income and no way to provide for her three sons and her mother-in-law. Family members and neighbors gossiped and spread cruel stories, leaving her reputation in shambles and making it nearly impossible to find work.

A few years later, Rina heard the Good News of Jesus for the first time at a local church. She believed quickly—but her relatives were outraged.

They mocked her faith and treated her with contempt, especially because her church welcomed believers from every caste. To them, it was scandalous for a woman from a high-caste family to worship alongside those from "lower" castes.

The opposition was so severe that for six months Rina could not even live at home. **She slept on the floor of the church**, just to escape the constant ridicule and abuse.



While there, **she received a Talking Bible in her own language of Odia**. For the first time, she could listen to the Scriptures from beginning to end. She started in Genesis and has already made her way through the book of Daniel—<u>where she found herself deeply encouraged</u>.

The story of Daniel in the lions' den spoke directly to her heart. Just as Daniel faced enemies who tried to destroy him, Rina has often been surrounded by people who insult and attack her faith. But she testifies that, just as God shut the lions' mouths, He has softened the hearts of her enemies. Today, many who once cursed her now speak kindly.

Through her Talking Bible, Rina also heard the words of Jesus from the cross: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing" (Luke 23:34). She took those words as if they were spoken directly to her—and God gave her the strength to forgive her own family members who continue to persecute her.

Friend, this is the power of God's Word.

Rina is still surrounded by challenges, but she now has peace. She has started a small baking business to provide for her family. She has been reunited with her husband after years of separation. And she continues to boldly share Jesus with others in her community.

"When I listen to the Talking Bible," Rina says, "I feel the strength to keep going. God's Word reminds me that I am not alone."
